

### **Conceptual Foundation**

The logo for the World Association for Person-Centered and Experiential Psychotherapy and Counseling (PCE World) employs a deliberate visual strategy that symbolizes inclusivity, diversity, and holistic human experience through the use of colour.

### **Color Palette**

The seven-color spectrum, derived from the rainbow, represents global diversity and interconnectedness. Each color symbolizes a continent, reflecting the organization's worldwide perspective and commitment to universal human understanding.

### **Typography**

The lowercase wordmark creates a sense of approachability and flow. By eliminating the visual interruption of case variation, the design ensures immediate legibility and emphasizes the organization's person-centered philosophy of smooth, unobstructed communication.

### Symbolic Interpretation

Colours: Representing the full spectrum of human experience, from vibrant to nuanced

Lowercase Typography: Signifying equality, accessibility, and removing hierarchical barriers

Graphic Execution: An abstract, inclusive visual language that mirrors the organization's empathetic approach to psychotherapy





### **Conceptual Foundation**

The logo creates a visual bridge between "pce" and "world", embodying the organization's core principle of interconnectedness. The abstract globe within the logo represents a minimalist, contemporary interpretation of global connectivity and builds a bridge to the previous world map in the old logo.

### **Chromatic Spectrum**

The extended color palette serves as a symbolic international flag, with each nuanced hue representing a specific psychological and cultural dimension:

Pink: Empathy, emotional vulnerability, and interpersonal sensitivity

Purple: Depth of introspection and transformative potential

Orange: Individual creativity and emotional energy Red: Passion, intensity, and emotional courage Blue: Therapeutic trust, communication, and

psychological safety

Dark Green: Profound growth and holistic healing Green: Renewal, personal development, and emerging potential

### Extended Logo

The alternative logo configuration introduces a dynamic visual language designed to maximize design flexibility. By extending the color bar across the composition, the identity system creates a powerful visual device for communication materials. This approach allows for versatile applications—from subtle branding to bold, attention-grabbing graphic treatments. The extended design enables to modulate the logo's visual impact across various media, from intimate conference materials to large-scale conference posters, ensuring consistent yet adaptable brand communication.


